

# 2024 Report


The GRow1000 program, established in 2020 by City Manager Dr. Mark Washington during the global pandemic as a strategy to mitigate the effects of the economic downturn, closures, and heighten racial injustices.

Over the course of five summers, GRow1000 has employed 1,150 youth in meaningful summer jobs at over 100 unique job sites at area businesses, nonprofit organizations, higher education institutions and governmental entities.

During the 2024 iteration of GRow1000, the City of Grand Rapids remained the employer of record and partnered with area employers who provide wage reimbursements to the City for their participation. A total of 162 young people ages 15 to 24 were employed from June 10 to July 19, 2024 and worked 20 hours per week for six weeks. Additionally, "GRowers" who opted in for a mentor were matched with local professionals who provided additional support to ensure a successful work experience.


For a second consecutive year, a series of professional development workshops was integrated into the GRow1000 experience. *GRow Further Fridays* (GFF) occurred every Friday for three hours at Grand Rapids City Hall.

GFF was curated by Our Community's Children, which managed GRow1000, to provide additional training on transferable skills and to build community among GRowers. Workshops included resume writing, entrepreneurship, dressing for success, financial literacy, college access and more.


## 2024 Youth Participant Survey
